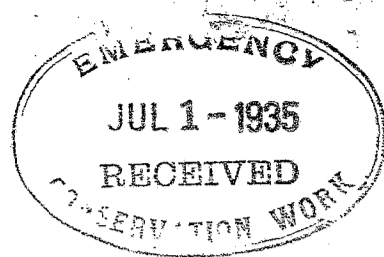

Grease traps in kitchen however no large grease traps in kitchen line. Camp screened throughout however fly control not particularly good. Bed Bugs present and will be especially hard to control due to buildings ceiled with wall board in interior. Suggest that Company commander use vaporizer. Infirmary is very good provided with ten beds also isolation ward which has been used lately as this camp has had one case monegitie and one case scarlet fever and one case diphtheria.
